I am becoming increasingly concerned that Ashford Homes are neglecting to manage the grounds of the old Roundstone School. The grass is being cut but not round the trees, the sycamores are not being controlled, the daffodils were never able to flower as they were mown over, the sunken garden is completely overgrown, the cordoned fruit trees have not been attended to, ivy is strangling many trees, the pond has all but disappeared and the metal fence that has been erected means that a very large peripheral area has become totally wild with cow parsley and brambles where before a meter width encouraged all sorts of wild life.

I am tempted to think this is being done on purpose to render the site unviable to wildlife to a large extent

Cannot this swathe of old orchard be used as an amenity for the community? There could be Apple days, days for bird watching and listening, days when music is played or a play is performed, nature days of finding clues about what does really live there or pass through, days for photography and painting, maypole dancing or even Scottish reels.

Please would you take these points into consideration.
