Thank you for your enquiry to RHS Gardening Advice

Scots pines (*Pinus sylvestris*) can ultimately grow into a large tree (up to 25m/80ft), but depending on growing conditions it may not reach this size. I wonder if your tree might actually be a black pine (*Pinus nigra*) as I cannot see the reddish coloured bark typical of Scots pine. Due to its large proportions, it is not the ideal tree for the average sized domestic garden. Its evergreen canopy may also cause significant shade with dry conditions beneath.
